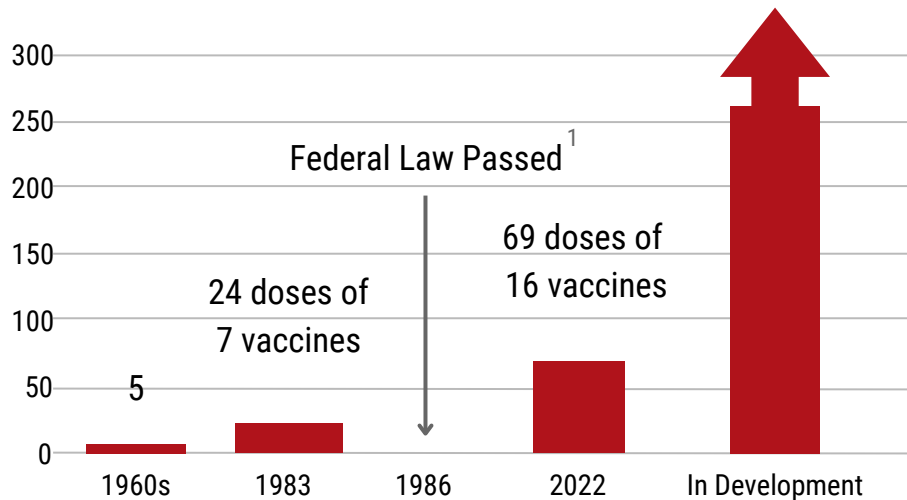


CDC Recommended Vaccine Doses: Birth to 18 Years



- In 1986, Congress passed the National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act of 1986, granting vaccine manufacturers and physicians **immunity from most lawsuits**.¹ Since the passing of this federal law, the childhood vaccine schedule has more than tripled. Pharmaceutical companies are developing more than 260 additional vaccines.²
- The 1986 Act also established The National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program. As of 12/2021, this cumbersome federal court process has **awarded over \$4.7 billion** to 8,513 victims of vaccine injury or death, despite 11,967 claims being denied.³
- Vaccines have **NEVER been assessed for carcinogenicity**⁴ despite containing known carcinogens, such as glyphosate, formaldehyde, and/or thimerosal, a mercury derivative in multi-dose flu shots approved for babies as young as 6 months old.⁵
