

Many PA pediatricians are refusing care to children whose families have a religious or moral objection to vaccination.

As a first-time mom, I was exhilarated to meet our sweet baby girl; she was a perfect, seven-pound miracle. However, her first pediatrician kicked us out of the office for refusing to give her a Hepatitis B shot.

I called several pediatric offices and finally found

one that would take us without following the schedule, but after two visits, we were also discharged for not being up to date on vaccines.

My daughter has eczema, which can indicate an allergy or an autoimmune condition. This was not considered and the vaccine schedule was the priority instead of her wellbeing.

The pediatricians asked NO questions about her health, and NO tests were done to see if she might adversely react to any of the vaccine ingredients. NO information about vaccine risks was given. We were just dismissed.

Currently, NO doctor will see my daughter.

Hepatitis B facts:

- Transmission requires direct contact with infected blood or other body fluids, typically through unprotected sex or IV drug use.
- Hepatitis B vaccine clinical trial subjects were followed for only 5 days.
- **Hepatitis B vaccine** post-marketing reports include encephalitis, encephalopathy, lupus, multiple sclerosis, Guillain-Barré syndrome, Bell's palsy, paralysis, seizures, and more.
- The U.S. Vaccine Adverse Events Reporting System includes **86,406** entries for Hepatitis Bcontaining vaccines, with **17,244** listed as serious and **1,944 deaths**, 81% in children under 3.
